Responsible for managing and performing several FDA approved and investigator initiated clinical trials in the field of dermatology for Dr. Mark Nestor and Dr. Brian Berman. Clinical trials performed involved the treatment of acne, hyperhidrosis, actinic keratoses, atopic dermatitis, pruritus, psoriasis, sun burns and rosacea. We conducted several cosmetic clinical trials; one involved the injection of a new botulinum toxin for the treatment of glabellar rhytids and another used a long acting beta-2 agonist injection for the treatment of abdominal fat.

## RESEARCH EXPERIENCE

During this experience I aided Dr. Nestor, sub-investigators and research coordinators in performing six different clinical trials during the month of February. The clinical trials included studies on reducing hyperhidrosis of the axillae, cosmetic fillers placed in the mid-face and lips, the use of medications for treating actinic keratoses of the face, injection of a medication into the abdomen for the reduction of "belly fat", and the application of a product to the forearms for the reduction of the appearance of senile purpura and photo-aging. I learned valuable information on how to run clinical trials meticulously so as to prevent data errors.

Responsibilities: helped perform the experiments, prepared the materials needed for each day, conducted a literature search and wrote the background information section for the senile purpura/photo-aging clinical trial protocol.

### **University of Miami Melanoma Program**, Miami, FL

I worked with melanoma cells to view the interactions of two proteins called rec-8 and gamma H2AX. Gamma H2AX is a protein involved in DNA repair and rec 8 is a protein found abnormally in mitosis of melanoma cells. I completed several experiments that involved irradiation of the melanoma cells and viewing the two proteins under immunofluorescence to see if they would co-localize together, possibly suggesting that rec-8 was involved in DNA repair. We did not find any co-localization; however, more studies are investigating the interaction of the two proteins in Dr. Grichnik's lab.

Responsibilities: culturing/passing melanoma cells, immunofluorescence staining, gel electrophoresis, western blot, radiation of melanoma cells.
